Personal, Social and Emotional	Making relationships	Takes steps to resolve conflicts with other children, e.g. finding a compromise.

Uses a pencil and holds it effectively to form recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed.
	Health and Self Care	Shows understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges, & considers & manages some risks. Shows understanding of how to transport & store equipment safely. Practices some appropriate safety measures without direct supervision.
Literacy	Reading	Enjoys an increasing range of books. Knows that information can be retrieved from books & computers.
	Writing	Uses some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning, representing some sounds correctly and in sequence. Writes own name and other things such as labels, captions. Attempts to write short sentences in meaningful contexts.
Mathematics	Numbers	Estimates how many objects they can see & checks by counting

	Shape, Space and Measures	<p>Orders two items by weight or capacity.</p> <p>Uses familiar objects & common shapes to create & recreate patterns & build models.</p> <p>Uses everyday language related to time.</p> <p>Beginning to use everyday language related to money.</p> <p>Orders & sequences familiar events.</p> <p>Measures short periods of time in simple ways.</p>
