## FOREST SCHOOL FUN

Every Monday all class teachers participate in training perfecting their teaching skills to ensure that we continue to deliver an outstanding curriculum.

Recently much fun (and learning) was had in Forest School. Mrs Page led an excellent training session with many new skills developed.

Forest school has been an excellent addition to the Polegate Irresistible Curriculum. The children develop resilience, problem solving and many more important attributes.

See bellow a small example of Forest School learning this term:

**Nursery -** bug hunting and naming/describing their features

**Reception - making butterfly feeders** 

**Yr 1 -** Looking at new growth and learning about the plants growing around the school site, making nettle tea, developing confidence with fires.

**Yr 2 & 5 - P**lanting seeds and getting the beds ready, using natural materials for art i.e. natural paintbrushes

**Yr 5 -** Also planting seeds, making greek pots with clay and ground brick dust, using tools that need higher levels of personal safety and risk assessment i.e. hand saws and bow saws

Teamwork and turn taking has been embedded within all of these activities.

We have also had a robin move into the greenhouse and begin nesting so we have to be very quiet/careful when we go in to check on the seedlings in there!

However, we live by the sea and too ensure that the children have lifesaving swimming skills is a lesson and life skill that cannot be ignored. We receive many emails about swimming but the email below highlights the success of our pool.

"I thought you might be interested that my child has moved up a level at her Hailsham swimming class to stage 3. I believe this means she can swim 5m now. I'm proud of her! She now gets to wear a yellow swim hat.

I've really noticed that since she started swimming at school this year, she has become very enthusiastic about swimming and has suddenly improved. In the winter months she was refusing to get in the pool for the first 10 minutes of each lesson at her Hailsham class. I really appreciate the

efforts the school go to to enable the children to swim regularly for half of the school year. It makes a big difference, even when they're already having lessons outside of school."

The year 6 reception buddies have been thoroughly enjoying their visits to reception. They are excellent role models taking Polegate Reading Without Limits very seriously.







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### FAMILY SCIENCE FUN!

Now the sun is finally making an appearance why not have some family fun with science and complete the activity below! Send Mrs Giggs your pictures so we can celebrate your efforts!

#### **Sun Dials**

Before the invention of clocks, people used the sun to help them tell the time.

One way that people used the sun to tell the time was by making sundials. Shadows created by a marker or pointer on a sundial can indicate the time of day.








#### Equipment:

- · A paper plate
- · A pen and pencil
- · A watch or clock
- · A piece of plasticine.

#### Method:

- Fold your paper plate in half, crease and unfold. Then fold the plate in half in the other direction, crease, and unfold.
- Write the number 12 at the top of the plate, on one of the creases.



Carefully push a pencil through the middle of the plate, where the two creases meet. Secure the pencil tip in a piece of plasticine underneath the plate and use it to stand your sundial securely in a sunny spot. 4. At exactly 12 pm, position your sundial so that the pencil's shadow is pointing to the number 12. Secure the sundial in this position so it now can't move. (If the sundial is moved, it will not show the right time).
