SAFE PARKING AT SCHOOL

I fully understand the school is not responsible for the parking (disabled or otherwise) outside the school, and I acknowledge the efforts you make to ensure people park safely and considerately.

However my elderly parents often deliver and collect my son, and often find they cannot park with their blue badge in either space as these are often occupied by parents in cars without blue badges.

This leaves my parents with the choice of parking in a less safe area near to school, which they are

concerned about, or exacerbating their physical symptoms by parking further away. They do ensure they arrive early, but even before 2:20pm have found sometimes spaces occupied.

I realise you occasionally send out children in fluorescent jackets accompanied by staff to dissuade people (which is effective for a couple of days), have visits from PCSOs and also write very informative advisory articles in the newsletter about people parking in unsafe or inappropriate areas, but most of these very few inconsiderate parents take no notice.

Of course, the vast majority of parents are considerate and safe in their parking.

My parents feel vulnerable and concerned about approaching people directly as they are unsure about the response they may receive.

I'm sure you have done this on many occasions, but I have contacted the police to ask how they can assist with this, as I am concerned about my parents becoming ill as a response of walking from further away.

Please help our families that suffer a disability and park considerately. Some families need to park in the disabled bay so please leave it free!

As you know they are brought in by prefects - no teachers in sight. They were sat waiting beautifully and I was so proud.

The following day I received a lovely email from a parent:

"I would just like to say how impressed I was with the whole school this morning when I came to see my daughter collect her star of the week.

I was amazed by the children organising themselves when they were coming into assembly. They were so well behaved and walked in and all sat without a fuss and in such a mature way. The singing by the choir was also lovely.

Throughout I was amazed at the wonderful behaviour of the children. The whole assembly made me feel quite emotional and so proud for my daughter to be involved in such a good school that clearly teaches the children how to be kind and polite children as well as how to excel in the academic.
