# PRIME MINISTER'S LETTER TO PARENTS ON BEST START IN LIFE

On the 4 September to mark the childcare expansion milestone, Prime Minister Keir Starmer wrote to parents reaffirming his Plan for Change promise to give children the best possible start with 75% of five-year-olds reaching a good level of development by 2028.

On 1 September 2025 the government launched the Best Start in Life website, as part of our **Plan for Change** and giving every child the Best Start in Life. This improved support for families builds on the proud legacy of Sure Start and will help more children be ready to start school.

The Best Start in Life website will officially replace the Childcare Choices website as the main source of information for early education and childcare support - offering a broader range of resources for families, including eligibility for childcare offers, information about free breakfast clubs and Best Start Family Hubs in their

area, and support on pregnancy through to starting school and beyond.

Although the website has changed, the offers for parents - such as support for working parents and the 2-year-old childcare offer - are not affected.

Visitors to the current Childcare
Choices website will be automatically redirected.

### **PARKING**

Parking seems to be a permanent article in my newsletter, so again, I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the importance of parking safely outside the school premises to ensure the safety of all our children and families.

As you are aware, the safety of our students is our utmost priority. We kindly ask that you refrain from parking on double yellow lines opposite the school, by road junctions, drop down curbs and driveways. Parking in these areas creates dangerous congestion and significantly hinders visibility for both pedestrians and drivers, potentially putting our children at risk.

The Senior Leadership Team (SLT) will be monitoring the situation closely

and, while they would much prefer to welcome pupils and families to school, they may need to ask individuals parking inappropriately to move on. We appreciate your cooperation in adhering to parking regulations, which are designed to foster a safe environment for our school community.

Additionally, we respectfully request that Blue Badge holders avoid parking directly opposite the school or near junctions and bends. This will help to facilitate safer access for all and minimise congestion around our entrances.

Thank you for your continued support in maintaining a secure and welcoming environment for our children. Together, we can ensure that drop-off and pick-up times remain safe for everyone involved.

#### ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

Polegate School recognises that positive behaviour and good attendance are essential in order for pupils to get the most from their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing and wider life chances.

#### **Punctuality Matters!**

As we continue to support our children's education, it is crucial to highlight the importance of punctuality. Frequent lateness can significantly impact your child's mental health, learning ability, concentration, and social interactions. Children who arrive late are at a considerable disadvantage when compared to their peers who consistently arrive on time. By arriving punctually, children are able to settle into their classes efficiently and engage more fully with the day's activities.

Punctuality is not merely a matter of routine; it fosters a positive learning environment. Late arrivals can disrupt the class and may cause embarrassment for the child who is late. Additionally, children miss essential information during the registration period, including any updates or the plan for the day. We must work together to ensure that our children recognise the value of arriving on time.

To assist you in ensuring punctuality, please be aware of the following timings: Gates for Key Stage 2 open at 8:15am, while those for Key Stage 1 open at 8:25am.

### Registers are taken promptly at 8:30am for Key Stage 2 and at 8:40am for Key Stage 1.

We understand that school mornings can be hectic; however, it is imperative to note that being just 15 minutes late each day equates to missing two weeks of school over the academic year. Let us work collaboratively to instil the value of punctuality in our children's lives.

#### **Term Time Holiday Absence**

Regular school attendance is imperative to ensure that all students receive the full benefits of their education. The Department for Education (DfE) emphasises that every child should attend school for at least 95% of the time, as

consistent attendance is crucial for academic success and personal development. When students miss school, even for a short period, it can significantly disrupt their learning experience and hinder their progress.

It is essential to note that taking holidays during term time can have serious repercussions. Parents should be aware that any absence not deemed exceptional will result in a fine, imposed by the local authority. Such measures are in place to underscore the importance of regular attendance and to support a culture of learning within our schools.

We understand that family commitments and holiday plans can affect attendance, but we urge parents to consider the long-term educational impacts of term-time absences. By prioritising attendance, we can collectively ensure that every child is given the opportunity to succeed, thereby enhancing their future prospects. We thank parents for their continued support in upholding these standards, and we look forward to working together to foster an environment where every child can thrive.

# CHAMPIONS ACADEMY PE SESSION

#### PLANK CHALLENGE

#### How to Play:

- Find an open and flat space without many obstacles.
- It's best to use some sort of mat to ensure you are comfortable while you plank.
- Lay down and clasp your fists together under your chest.
- Point your toes towards the ground, and lift yourself up off the ground into the position shown below, making sure your keep your back straight and hips up!
- Set a stopwatch, and for every ten seconds you plank up to the 30 second mark you earn one point, after 30 seconds every ten seconds is worth 2 points. Following the one minute mark, you will earn three points for every ten seconds you continue to plank!

#### Make it Easier:

- Lift your legs onto a yoga ball, or sofa and extend your arms.
- Breathe steadily to engage your abdominal muscles.

#### Make it Harder:

 Extend your arms into a push up position and hold the plank like that.
