NUMBERS COUNT

An intensive intervention for children who find maths really difficult.

Numbers Count is a highly effective intervention. It is delivered by a specially trained teacher to children who find mathematics extremely difficult and may not reach Level 3 at the end of Key Stage 2.

It helps them to get back on track and catch up with their peers. Over 35,000 children have taken part in Numbers Count since 2008, making average Number Age gains of 15 months in one term.

I am really pleased that we are now able to offer this intervention at Polegate. Mrs Chadwick delivers this element. There is now an additional intervention as part of this programme that targets pupils in year 3 and 4. Mrs Stevens will be working for a day and a half

each week delivering this to pupils in Year 1 and 2. It complements our Reading Recovery really well. Lessons take place in a dedicated teaching area where children can use a wide variety of resources. The teacher begins by making a detailed diagnostic assessment of what each child knows and then plans an individualised programme to help each one to move forward.

Lessons focus on number and calculation, follow a set routine and are rigorous and active. The teacher aims to help each child to become numerate and confident, to enjoy actively learning mathematics and to develop the skills and positive attitudes needed to continue to make good progress in normal class mathematics lessons after completing Numbers Count.



What is Bikeability Level 2?

Bikeability Level 2 is designed to build on the skills and confidence already gained in Level 1, now progressing onto quiet roads. The aim is to encourage and inspire children to use their bikes more, making safe trips on roads to school or for leisure.

What will my child be doing?

- All the fun of the Level 1 part of Bikeability
- Start & finish an on-road journey
- Understand how & when to signal intentions to other road users
- Turning left and right on minor and major roads
- Dealing with potential hazards
- Demonstrate a basic understanding of the Highway Code



How much will it cost?

The course will cost only £10.00 and include 1.5 hours of Level 1 fun cycling skills within the school grounds and up to a further 6 hours of on-road practical cycling skills on quite roads away from school. All Level 1 outcomes must be met before continuing onto the Level 2 on-road course.

The course is free to children claiming free school meals.

What do I need to have for my child to take part?

- A safe working bike (all bikes will be checked at start of Level 1 part of course)
- They must be able to ride without stabilisers fitted
- They will need a correctly fitted helmet
- Suitable clothing for weather on the day (Lightweight waterproofs if wet and gloves if cold)
- Sun cream to protect from sunburn

Can my child still take part if they don't have a bike or helmet?

YES... We can supply a bike and helmet, subject to availability and with reasonable notice given.

All their costumes were fantastic and they thoroughly enjoyed meeting Queen Victoria herself! Who know where we will travel to next!


Year 2 Sealife Centre Trip
