Pegasus is our winning house so far!




### YEAR 1 AUTHOR VIRTUAL VISIT




### Hello everyone, lots of you already know me as I feel I have grown up at Polegate School.

# SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

We are delighted to announce the theme of this year's Summer Reading Challenge, produced by The Reading Agency and delivered in partnership with libraries: Wild World Heroes Summer Reading Challenge 2021.



The Reading Agency have teamed up with WWF for a nature themed Summer Reading Challenge and will encourage children to discover how they can make a difference to the environment. The Challenge will begin on Saturday 17 July and end on Saturday 11 September in all East Sussex Libraries.

Children's reading can 'dip' during the long summer holidays if they do not have regular access to books and encouragement to read for pleasure and this can be a problem for schools to put right in the new term.

The Reading Agency's annual Summer Reading Challenge really helps by getting over 700,000 children regularly into libraries over the summer. There is no other free reading activity that involves so many children, introduces families to their library, encourages children to choose books freely and independently and is endorsed by parents, teachers and the Department for Education.

Children need a library card and PIN to take part. If they don't already have one they can join the library online (card will be posted to home address) or in any branch. They then need to sign up to the Challenge at

www.eastsussex.gov.uk/src

#### What does the Challenge involve?

Children sign up to Wild World Heroes, then visit their local library to collect a Reader Record and sticker as a reward for taking part.

Choose 6 library books to read. They can be any type: fiction/non-fiction, e-books, e-audio books, Bag Books for children with special educational needs, books on CD - it's up to them.

Children do not need to be independent readers to take part. They can share their books with friends and family. They do not need to borrow all their books at once.

After they have read each book they can come back to the library, tell us their doing the Challenge and collect the appropriate prize.

When they have read and told us about 6 books they will receive a Wild World Heroes pencil, medal and certificate for completing the Summer Reading Challenge. As usual we will give them the option of having their certificates presented in school assembly. We will send the certificates to schools at the beginning of October.

# PFA UPDATE

#### Wow...we can't believe we are into the last part of another school year!

#### From all of us on the PFA, thank you for all of the support you have given us with our fundraising events this year.

### **Attendance**

Sadly, children have lost so much time in school recently and we all keep our fingers crossed that we are seeing a return to normal when we can focus on what is going to make a difference to your child's attainment and progress without distraction.

### We are looking forward to a term 6 where we can be aspirational for your children and expect the best.

Attendance and punctuality are an important part of good behaviour and such an important life skill. It is an essential requirement in any job and habits formed early become embedded. Pupils who miss valuable time in classrooms fall further behind and become more disengaged from the work of the class, it is hard to regain this ground and hard to motivate pupils when attendance drops.

Our expectation is 100% which pre Covid was normal for children at Polegate. We are optimistic we will return to this in term 6. Please do contact us if you are having any difficulties or face challenges we may not be aware of.

You have been totally brilliant at arriving for earlier starts and so we are not anticipating any lates!

As a reminder term 6 arrangements change with a much reduced staggered start. Learning will start promptly at registration so children arriving after this will be marked as late. Please ensure they arrive promptly so they don't miss out on learning

# STANDARDS, SUCCESS & EXPECTATIONS

#### We work hard to maintain fair and consistent standards at Polegate which is one of the many reasons we are so successful.

The essentials such as uniform, attendance and manners are 'basics' which mean when these are right we can focus on the important essentials of learning and supporting individual needs.

This last year every kind of normal has been tested and we have shown flexibility and adapted to these ever changing circumstances. We have recognised the importance of being empathetic and shown understanding of unique and individual circumstances. We have extended this understanding over the last six weeks. We recognise children may have out grown shoes, uniform and these may have been challenging to replace.

We now need to ensure that our normal routines and expectations are established as part of the consistent and secure environment that enables staff and pupils to work most effectively.

We ask for your full support in ensuring this is in place, ensuring all pupils return in Term 6 with the correct uniform, allowing us to focus on the aspects of education that make the biggest difference.



#### UNIFORM REMINDER FOR THE SUMMER TERM

### We recognise that most of our children have a full uniform and PE kit.

All uniform needs to be in line with our policy which can be found by clicking https://polegateschool.co.uk/public/data/chalk/file/3/5/Polegate%20School%20Handbook.pdf

We ask that over the May holiday this is checked in preparation for the start of Term 6.

#### Our basic uniform is as follows:

- short or long grey or black trousers (not denim or cord or sports/tracksuit bottoms)
- grey or black skirt or pinafore dress (girls only)
- green gingham summer dress (girls only)
- white shirt/blouse/polo shirt (with school name)
- green crew necked sweatshirt with school name
- green sweatshirt/cardigan with school name
- black jogging suit (PE)
- Black school shoes not trainers or boots
- plain white or grey socks
- green baseball cap with school logo
- green (winter) woolly hat with logo
- black showerproof fleece with school logo

#### Particular attention should be paid to shoes

**School Shoes:** Trainers are not an option, polishable school shoes are the only type of shoe that is acceptable.

If you have any challenges as a family in meeting these expectations, please speak to us. Uniform provides equality; school uniforms also create a level playing field of expectations. Uniforms are an equalizer and we want all children to feel equal and uniform is key to this. We will help if any family is struggling so again I want to encourage you to raise this with us.

#### PFA PRE-LOVED UNIFORM

In the last few years the PFA have established a successful pre-loved uniform shop. To save money we would recommend parents look here to refresh uniform and ensure the uniform is compliant with our policy. They would also be happy to take any donations of uniform that is too small. This uniform can be delivered to school.
