







# IMPORTANT CHANGES TO ASSESSMENT & TESTING

**There have been many changes that schools have had to implement from September 2014:**

- A whole new National Curriculum
- The removal of levels to assess the attainment and progress of pupils on the national curriculum
- A new SEND code of practice

**We want to keep you well informed about these changes and the implications.**

From September 2014, the system for assessing the attainment and progress of children in KS1 and KS2 changed. Although children who are currently in Year 2 and Year 6 will continue with the previous Maths and English curriculum and its end of year assessment procedures, children in Year 1, 3, 4 and 5 will no longer be assessed using 'Levels'.

In school we have traditionally reported to you your child's attainment in Maths and Reading and Writing as being low (c), secure (b) or high (a) within a certain Level and we have done that at the end of each term. We have also discussed their rate of progress in relation to the number of sub-levels they have moved. Nationally this has now changed as the government felt that schools

should have greater autonomy in deciding how they assess pupil achievement, and that the Levels system had become outdated and was no longer fit for purpose. It was also felt that parents did not feel that Levels were clear enough in explaining their child's attainment and progress. You may well disagree with this!

This is a challenge for all schools nationally at the moment! We are continuing to track each child's progress and we are continuing to provide you with information about the standards your child is achieving in each subject- well above, above, average etc. We are very clear on how well each and every child in the school is doing and continue to use all forms of assessment as a means to improve their progress.

There is much work to be done with other local schools, both primary and secondary to ensure consistency. While as a school the Department for Education will provide us with more specific information as to what the end of Year 6 expectations will be, it is up to us to use the National Curriculum document to decide what end of year expectations for Years 3 to 5 look like across all the subjects so that we can report confidently to parents.

The National Curriculum has changed significantly. What is really important for you to understand is that expectations have been raised!

There is increased challenge across the whole curriculum. For example, in maths formal written methods are introduced earlier. Long division and algebra will be an expectation for Year 6.

There are greatly increased expectations for both Infants and Juniors in grammar and punctuation. Children in Year 2 next year will have a grammar and punctuation test. The key issue here is that a child who may have always been achieving the expected level (average) may not achieve this level within the new curriculum, in fact they may drop into the 'below average' bracket. This will not be an indication that your child is not working as hard (or the teacher!) It will not necessarily be a problem.

There will be a transition period in which the children adapt to the new expectations and teaching addresses all the new elements that have not previously been covered.

**I know this may all seem confusing and as this is such an important area I will be holding meetings to discuss these changes. Please look out for dates next term.**




