Learning around the school is exciting and your children are visibly engaged with the topics.




Following all our staff training (INSET days) on writing we have seen some stunning examples of writing across the school and pupils making rapid progress which is so impressive.

Please keep up that reading during the holiday, there is nothing more important you can do to help your child with their future success!


We have once again launched our whole school readers - you may want to read these yourselves at home as well if you are stuck for a book to read. They are loving these stories.

ATTENDANCE

We strongly believe in tackling attendance early before it causes longer term problems for your child and there are many reasons why we address this from the very start of the year.

Pupils who missed 2 to 4 days in September were 5 times more likely than those who missed fewer than 2 days to be chronically absent for the year. Half the pupils who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.

This is a significant amount of time. We firstly aim to support. Please share with us any difficulties you face as a family- we want to help!

If attendance is causing a concern you will be invited in for a meeting to discuss the reasons behind it and offer support.

Higher attendance clearly equates with success and higher earnings later in life. This may seem obvious but if you were in any doubt attendance is the building block of pupil achievement. The bottom line is that if they are not in school then they are not learning.

Some of you may remember this group or if not you may have a distant recollection of what it was all about but for some of you this will be completely new! Lock down and everything that came with it put a stop to our termly meetings.

I am hoping to relaunch these meetings again now that we can finally meet face to face. I really valued these opportunities to meet and discuss school ideas with a range of parent representatives from each year group.

The Think Tank is a group of parent representatives, one from each year group at least, who meet to discuss general school-related issues. This Forum provides a valuable way to listen to your ideas, suggestions and seek your views on our ideas, helping to ensure the needs of the children and their families are met

This has been a really successful initiative that has been in place for an unbelievable 7 years now! Part of the success of this group is down to the fact that the parents share the aims of the school to:

- To support and promote children's learning
- To help the school find out what parents and carers think about important issues

- To involve parents and carers actively in school decisions
- To make plans that support the ways the school wants to develop and improve outcomes for our children.

The school has benefited hugely from their support and I have certainly appreciated their views and commitment. They always have solutions and suggestions at the ready.

I don't want to put any parents on the spot by announcing who was in it before because your circumstances may well have changed. You may not have the capacity you once had. I know the parents that were representatives for different year groups and if you want to continue then that would be fabulous but equally if you no longer able to then I will open this opportunity out to others. You have the opportunity to return the slip to say you will continue or will not below. Just let us know.

The role of this group.

It is important that all parents understand this group is not in place to address specific concerns about an individual child or issues relating to individual members of staff. Parents who need to discuss these issues should follow school procedures relating to this, approaching their class teacher in the first instance.

We know that when parents are involved in their child's learning and in the life of the school, children do better. This is borne out by a growing body of research. Parental involvement is a key lever for school improvement and we are lucky to have such a committed group of parents.

If you are interested in this role then please return this expression of interest to the school office and we will approach you if there is a vacancy for your year group. Honestly there is no expectation you bring anything but yourself and your thoughts and opinions with an openness to listen and respect other parent's views. The more diverse and representative the group is of our community the better!

The Think Tank's first agenda item is Home Learning following a parent suggestion and recommendation that we also invest in Doodle spelling and Doodle English.

The meetings take place in the school day generally a Thursday afternoon, once a term, at 2.30pm just before pick up at the end of the day.




Can I use my existing Amazon.co.uk account on AmazonSmile?
