Year 6 arrived back, after their Christmas break, to find the Metropolitan Police had set up a crime scene for them to investigate.





INSET DAY


During a recent inset day teachers and support staff participated in Makaton training. The sessions were highly entertaining with lots of fun learning, practising and applying new skills.
