Well done, Reception.










THE LEGO CLUB


HISTORY CLUB


History Club term 1 have enjoyed creating timelines of our local area.


Felix Burke (a regular history club attendee) gave a speech about the Cuckoo Line and railways in our town.

Whether you're sharing a bedtime story with a toddler, listening to a 7-year-old tackle new words, or discussing a teenager's latest book obsession, these moments build literacy skills, emotional resilience, and a lifelong love of learning.













WHY READING WITH YOUR CHILD MATTERS

The evidence is clear: children who read regularly at home perform better academically and develop stronger emotional resilience.

WHAT THE DATA SAYS/KEY FACTS ABOUT CHILDREN'S READING IN THE UK:

- Children who read daily are three times more likely to have high wellbeing than children who rarely read, according to the National Literacy Trust's 2024 research
- Only 34% of children aged 8-18 read daily in their free time, the lowest level since 2005
- The average child who reads for pleasure performs better in reading tests by the equivalent of 8 months of schooling, according to the Education Endowment Foundation
- 82% of disadvantaged children don't own a book of their own

Reading together helps children develop vocabulary, concentration, empathy, and imagination. It also creates a safe space for conversations about feelings, experiences, and the world around them.




Catch and Clap 60 Second Challenge
