ATTENDANCE

Importance of phoning in when your child is absent

The Department for Education regulate strict school attendance laws in the United Kingdom. Schools are legally required to maintain an attendance register, and they must tell the local authority about pupils who are regularly absent or have missed at least 10 school days without the school's authority.

If your child is ill, the school should be informed as soon as reasonably practical so that this can be entered on the school's register.

We have certain responsibilities under safeguarding for example, it is possible that a child has walked to school on their own and something serious has happened. Parents are left thinking that their child is in school and safe and unless we check a day could pass before anyone realises a child is missing. It can take up a lot of office time for us to call if we are not notified. If we are not notified and we can't get through then the next step is to notify the police as we cannot be sure they are safe and they carry out a welfare check. This has happened in the past.

Schools are under a safeguarding duty to investigate any unexplained absences under Section 175 of the Education Act 2002. This is for the child's safety and protection.

Thank you to all the acts that were brave enough to share their artistic or comic skills with us.




OUR TEACHING SCHOOL
