READING IS SOMETHING JUST FOR SCHOOL, ISN'T IT?

I am pleased to say that thankfully that is not something any of our parents say. You value this time with your children. I personally love it, it is so special at the end of a long day just to snuggle up with my children and read.

Teachers are having a real push on the 7 nights in a row and will be encouraging all children to achieve this. It is doable, we can all find 5 minutes every day to listen to a story. The difference it makes is incredible.

THESE ARE THE REASONS WHY WE PROMOTE READING SO MUCH AT POLEGATE

Pupil A

Reads 20 minutes each day 3600 minutes in a school year 1,800,000 words

What about a pupil that doesn't read regularly at home or perhaps not at all? What are their chances of success?

This is why, at Polegate, we place so much importance on reading at home. All research and studies show that children who read every day do better at every stage of their education. We see it in school; the pupils that read at home are making better progress.

We are very fortunate at Polegate school to have so many supportive families that promote regular reading and learning at home and this reflects in the results our pupils achieve.

"For the majority of young people, enthusiastic and habitual reading is the single most predictive personal habit for the ability to achieve desirable life outcomes."

Pupil B

Reads 5 minutes each day 900 minutes in a school year 282,000 words

Reading to child in an interactive style raises his or her IQ by over 6 Points

"Children who read 3,000 words per day will be in the top 2% of standardised tests."

Pupil C

Reads 1 minute each day 180 minutes in a school year

By the end of Year Pupil A will have read the equivalent of 60 whole school days. Pupil B will have read only 12 school days.

SAFER INTERNET DAY

Safer Internet Day is on 6 February 2018, a day that is very important to our school and pupils.

Safer Internet Day in the UK is organised by the UK Safer Internet Centre (www.saferinternet.org.uk), and this year's theme is "Create, connect and share respect: A better internet starts with you!". There are lots of materials to help parents support children with their online use and these can be found at the website address above.

Within the school a focus for us is always for us to develop an understanding in our pupils to show respect for all people and communicate and act online as we would towards each other in real life. Consequently, we were thrilled when coming to the realisation that this was the national theme of this year's 2018 Safer Internet Day!

We believe that online safety education is an important element of the curriculum and an essential part of young people's development. We do hope that you will be able to support our online safety work by discussing the broader issues with your child and reinforcing them in your home environment. We really would appreciate the support of our whole community in working with our young people in particular on the theme of respect and considering how we model this to young people through our own interactions.

To celebrate the many positives of the internet, and to raise awareness of the issues that children and young people face online today, we will be speaking in assemblies in



addition to various other activities in the school day. We have visiting speakers to support this work.

NO PENS WEDNESDAY

We put aside our pens and pencils on Wednesday. The idea comes from the charity, the Communication Trust, a coalition of 50 not-for-profit organisations working together to raise awareness and support speech, language and communication needs.

Children across the school enjoyed a day where they didn't have to do any writing. On this day learning was all about discussion, engaging in practical activities with lots of speaking and listening and problem solving. The children loved it.

Poor language is linked to poor behaviour even in very young children. 2 in 3 language delayed 3 year olds have behaviour problems.

At Polegate we believe of all the skills we develop at school, the ability to communicate effectively is the one that has the most profound and potentially positive impact on our lives. This is why we debate and teach philosophy across the school.






STUDENT TEACHERS




OLIVIA'S MARVELLOUS HOME SCHOOL JOURNAL


The use of the reading section of the journals is so well established now.




Next week I hope to see children engaging in imaginative play, cooperating and using loose parts and scrap every break and lunchtime!


