HOLIDAY REQUESTS

I was hoping it wouldn't happen but unfortunately it is! With lockdown easing the requests for holidays have started and we have suddenly had a flurry of these arriving in the office!

Now more than ever before children need to be in school — there has been so much lost learning! I want to explain our stance on this now so there is real clarity and make no apologies for our position on this. We want the best for your children. In recent years, the government has cracked down on school absences and all schools have tightened their policies on requests for authority to take a child on holiday.

Given the disruption over the last two years and limited time children have spent in school we are not in a position to approve any further absence for any child.

Taking holidays in term time will affect a child's schooling as much as any other absence and we expect parents to help us by not taking children away in school time.

There is no automatic entitlement in law to time off in school time to go on holiday.

Amendments to the 2006 regulations make clear that the Headteacher may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

So what is considered exceptional?

I hope that by sharing this guidance it will make the restrictions we work under clear and transparent. All parents have been saying that their circumstances are exceptional and the leave is exceptional when it is not. The criteria is high and I hope these examples will demonstrate this.

Examples of any exceptional circumstances where leave may be granted during term time are as follows:

- If a parent is service personnel and is returning from a tour
 of duty abroad where it is evidenced the individual will not
 be in receipt of any leave in the near future that coincides
 with school holidays.
- Where an absence from school is recommended by a health professional as part of a parent or child's rehabilitation from a medical or emotional issue.
- Out of school programmes such as music, arts or sport operating at a high standard of achievement. Documentary evidence of this event will be required.

 Religious observance – The Education Act 1996 S444(3) (c), states "on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which his/her parent belongs"

Where there are exceptional and unforeseen circumstances that fall outside of the above, the Headteacher agrees to consult with the governing body prior to any authorisation being given to the parent.

Evidence would be required in each case.


If a request meets the above exceptional circumstances we would still need to be convinced that the leave could not be taken at another time, for example in the school holidays.

Sadly, children have lost so much time in school recently and we all keep our fingers crossed that we are seeing a return to normal when we can focus on what is going to make a difference to your child's attainment and progress without distraction. We have all been through an exceptional time, including teachers who have been

We are looking forward to a term 6 where we can be aspirational for your children and expect the best.

Attendance and punctuality are an important part of good behaviour and such an important life skill. They may miss valuable experiences such as the transition week if they take holidays now.

Our expectation is 100% which pre Covid was normal for children at Polegate. We are optimistic we will return to this in term 6. Please do contact us if you are having any difficulties or face challenges we may not be aware of.

EMAIL COMMUNICATION

Since lockdown began we have relied increasingly on email communication and this has enabled communication to remain strong between home and school.

We really value this and it has been so important during the time parents have not been able to come into school. Please continue to email as the office remains closed and actually we have got into some really good habits but I would just like to take this opportunity to set expectations so that we can manage these successfully.

The volume of emails that teachers receive directly has increased immensely. Generally, their days start at around 7.30am when they will be busy preparing and setting up their classrooms. At the end of the day they may be running clubs or be in meetings until 5pm. During the day they have a full teaching timetable which does not leave a huge amount of

time for them to respond. We always aim to respond and the expectation is within 48 hours.

Whilst you may not get a response immediately, I can guarantee that will have been seen and acted upon immediately. I know teachers are feeling increasingly anxious about trying to keep on top of the emails and finding time to respond. Please be patient and understanding. We care so much and often go over and above but it is important this is not taken for granted.

If you are expecting a response please do say so the expectation is made clear. Teachers may feel it is not required if you are simply sharing information.

Teachers are instructed not to respond to emails after 6pm so if you send them late in the evening I would not be expecting them to respond at this time.
