In our first meeting of the year I shared a sneak preview of our new website and we discussed what you all find most useful.

We also spoke about the new attendance policy and it has been agreed that for most parents the new expectations do not cause any problems or concern.

I have received one email raising concern about doctors' workload and this being an additional pressure for them. I have been liaising with surgeries and they did not share this view. Over the course of the year hardly any children have 3 days off in a row and in all these cases the children did visit the doctors.

Regarding the 48 hour rule this applies if your child has a virus and or condition that is contagious. There are

occasions when children are sick but it is not contagious for example if a child has a severe migraine, has eaten too much! In these cases it is not a virus and so it may not be necessary to follow the 48 hour rule. I am sure parents will be happy to apply their judgement and common sense if their children are ill.

STAND UP FOR EAST SUSSEX

The people of East Sussex are not getting a fair deal.

You may have already seen that East Sussex County Council has launched a fairer funding campaign – Stand Up For East Sussex.

Years of funding cuts mean many people in our county are at risk of real hardship. The resources East Sussex needs to care for the vulnerable, to help children reach their potential, to grow the economy and to build good transport links are dwindling away. The county has made savings of £112 million since the start of the decade. That money would have been enough to pay for the annual care of 5,600 vulnerable people or to fix 2 million potholes.

We're urging people across East Sussex to stand up for their county by calling on the Government to give them a fairer deal.

We're asking residents and businesses to sign a petition to the Prime Minister which calls for an urgent rethink on the resources the county receives. In 2014 Ofsted rated 64 per cent of primary schools in East Sussex as good or outstanding. In 2017 its 91 per cent and we want the Government to give us a long-term funding plan to maintain that success. The campaign also highlights how adult social care, transport, and jobs and the economy would benefit from a fairer funding deal.

READING

DAVID WALLIAM'S NEW BOOK COMES TO POLEGATE SCHOOL!

As you know reading is a whole school priority for us and to inspire the whole school community to read we are all going to read the same book!

Next week we will begin reading the new David Walliam's book which we are sure they are going to love! We hope it will get all the children talking about the story from reception to year 6.

Did you know?

Good reading at the age of 10 is a predictor of the number of GCSEs children will achieve and beyond that it can even predict future earnings at 42! Needless to say this is a positive correlation!

Did you know?

At age 7 the best readers, those in the top 25% of the country have on average a knowledge of 7100 words. Children that are in the bottom 25% have only 3000 words. This difference is huge and

the impact is far reaching. Research tells us the main influence on this is parents. At the age of 7, your influence is 6 times greater than school!

I would like to congratulate the parents and pupils in 5GK because the whole class consistently get raffle tickets and the children are passionate readers! It is also no surprise that they are doing well in all their other subjects as well!

Every single child at Polegate should be either listening to stories and/ or reading every evening. We are all busy I completely understand that however even 5 minutes of reading just before bedtime will make a difference and is really special!

Did you know?

Your child does not always need to read an AR book? AR is only a tiny part of what we do to support and promote reading at Polegate.

The most important thing is that your child enjoys reading and becomes a confident skilled reader. Sometimes having a break from AR can be helpful for many reasons. Alternating AR and other books, magazines, newspapers, non fiction can maintain an excitement about reading. As long as they are reading we are happy! If you are experiencing any difficulties or you think your child is lacking motivation to read then please do speak to your child's class teacher. We are very happy to help.

We are reviewing AR at the moment and would welcome your views.

On our website in the class pages we have a list of recommended books for each year group. These will be given out at parent consultation evening as well.

Dad says it just goes to show, Summer Reading does pay off It certainly does!



WHO TO CONTACT IN SCHOOL

We all welcome contact with parents and value communication between home and school at Polegate and place great importance on this.

One of my highlights every day is seeing the children arrive and talking to parents in the morning.

Teachers are available after school every day except a Monday or a day they may be running an after school club.

Please don't try and discuss matters with teachers before school because this is when they are preparing for the day. If you have any questions or concerns please do pop in – this is much better than letting worries build. You don't need to wait until Parent Consultation.

- 1. Your first point of contact should always be with your child's class teacher, they know your child the best and issues can be resolved quickly.
- 2. Your next point of contact should be with a Leader of Learning. These teachers are part of the schools leadership team and have responsibility for certain year groups
- 3.The schools deputy headteacher Mrs Jones leads the Early years and year 1, Miss Ashdown for year 2 and year 3 and Miss Regan for years 4, 5 and 6

If you have tried all these channels and concerns remain then please do contact me. If you have any feedback at all about any aspect of the school then we would love to hear it as we are always aspiring to do better.

Morning drop off

Please write any messages you have down and post these in the box by the side of the main door. Members of staff can sometimes be inundated with verbal messages, the danger of this is they may forget to pass a message on. They are really there to welcome the children, not to take messages.

STAYING SAFE ONLINE

The internet is amazing. Children can play, learn, create and connect opening up a whole world of exciting possibilities.

But with the digital world changing all the time, how can you make sure your child's staying safe?

There are a range of resources on our website and the NSPCC have provided some very useful resources for parents.

Whether you want to set up parental controls, adjust privacy settings or get advice on social networks, experts from the free O2 & NSPCC helpline are here to help. 0808 800 5002

What are the risks of online games?

- Children may view inappropriate or upsetting content if they play games that aren't suitable for their age. This could include sexual or violent material. It might be in-game content or produced by other players.
- Some players can be abusive towards others or try to exclude them from the game. Some players may also hack another user's account or try to steal and destroy their virtual possessions. This can be as upsetting for a young person as if it happened in real life.
- Children may play with adults they don't know. People of all ages play games. Some adults may exploit this and try to build an emotional connection with a child for the purpose of grooming.
- Some children may find it hard to stop playing games or find that gaming is getting the way of them doing other activities.



5 ways to help children play safe

1. Check the game's content

Always check age ratings but remember they don't cover everything. It's important to check the game out yourself before letting a young child play it.

If you want extra information about the content of a boxed console or computer game, take a look at the Video Standard's Council's Additional Consumer Information (ACI)

2. Know how to mute, block and report

Help children understand that people they meet online may not always be who they claim to be. Some games let you mute, block and report other users.

Make sure your child knows how to do this if someone in the game upsets them or makes them feel uncomfortable. Childline has online gaming advice to help them do this. Remind your child they can come to you if they're ever worried.

3. Be Share Aware

Remind your child not to give out any personal information, photos or videos to anyone online, even if they know them. If your child plays games with people they don't know, remind them not to take the conversation off the game, onto other social networks or into a private chat. **Find out more about being Share Aware.**

4. Activate safety settings

Turn on parental controls on gaming consoles to help prevent children from downloading age inappropriate games or seeing harmful material.

The Apple App Store lets you turn off in-app purchases on iPads and iPhones. And The Apple App Store and Google Play let you create a pin code that must be entered before you buy.

You can also turn on privacy settings on some games to control what other users can see about you and stop strangers from contacting you.
