HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME

There has been a great deal of publicity recently regarding holidays in term time. There has been a very high profile case which reached the high courts.

East Sussex County Council would like to update you on the stance they are taking.

On Thursday 6th April 2017 the Supreme Court announced their ruling in the Platt versus Isle of Wight case. The Supreme Court ruled against Mr Platt, ending a long period of uncertainty for schools and Local Authorities around issuing penalty notices for unauthorised absences taken in term time.

A Department for Education spokeswoman said: "We are pleased the Supreme Court unanimously agreed with our position – than no child should be taken out of school without good reason".

Unauthorised Absence Requests

Taking a child out of school during term time disrupts both their education and the education of other pupils in their cases.

Sadly I have seen an increase in requests for holidays in term time this term. This is really disappointing especially as I really do stress to all families considering sending their child to Polegate School that we do not approve or expect families to remove children from learning for a holiday.

PASSPORT SIGNATURES

I have been a little inundated with passports to sign which I am more than happy to do.

Some parents have made a donation to the school fund as a thank you. We have used this to go towards the pool. This has been greatly appreciated. They recognise that most professionals such as doctors would charge a fee to do this.

I would like to make it very clear that I will not be signing any passports if a family is intending to take a holiday in term time!

Lovely email from a supply agency that visited the school this week:



FUNDING CUTS

Impact of funding cuts on our school budget

Schoolcuts.org.uk/ show that in East Sussex an estimated £22 million in budget change by 2019, that's roughly £369 per pupil a loss of 591 teachers.

The Ravilious & Co exhibition is also the foundation for another exciting project as we have teamed up with Eastbourne Sunshine Carnival to take our much loved Annual Schools Exhibition on the road. This year it will take the form of a friendship themed carnival display, featuring artwork made by more than 1,500 children from 32 local schools who have taken part in free workshops with carnival artists Same Sky, all of which has been possible thanks to the generous support of The Williams Charitable Trust.

The carnival, which is now in its sixth year, will take place on the same day as *Ravilious & Co* opens – 27 May, and the artwork made by the children will be displayed in Towner's section of the carnival procession which takes place 2pm and will follow the established route down Eastbourne's seafront from Western Lawns to Princes Park. We hope to see you there!

OUR SWIMMING POOL

Thank you to all 298 parents that have contributed towards the cost of swimming. I think it might come as a surprise to see what other schools charge.

Stone Cross who use the Lagoon in Hailsham charge £27.50 for 10 weeks of swimming. **Willingdon** charge £30 for 10 weeks, once a week at Ocklynge School.

All we ask for is £10 for 12 weeks and in one term children swim twice a week. Compared to other schools this is less than half! Amazing value.

We also don't have to waste valuable learning time by travelling to a pool. The Think Tank, as you know feel upset and disappointed that parents don't pay, have suggested that lessons in Term 6 be focused on those parents who are really committed to their child swimming and value this experience. All children have benefitted from swimming across the school – no one has been excluded. So in term 6 those children whose parents have indicated they want them to swim and have paid will have lessons. Other children can continue with their learning in class. This is in line with music tuition such as piano and guitar which is offered to children at a cost. If you would like your child to benefit from lessons in term 6 please ensure that if you haven't already paid that you do so before the start of Term 6. The swimming payment has been open on ParentMail since

October last year to give you the opportunity to pay over a period of time. The exception to this will be year 6.

It is compulsory for one year group to swim and so we have made the decision to offer this to year 6. Every child in this year group will continue to swim throughout term 6 regardless of whether parents have paid or not. For all other children only those whose parents have paid will swim.



SCHOOL TRIPS

We cannot afford to subsidise trips and very reluctantly we have needed to cancel a year 2 trip to Kidzania due to lack of contributions which totalled £621.

It is heart breaking when we have to do this because we know these experiences enrich the curriculum and provide such memorable experiences for the children.

I hated doing this and we all agonised over it sending out so many reminders in the hope that parents had simply forgotten. Sadly this was not the case and despite consultation in advance of any planning in which all parents said they would pay – they didn't. Teachers work hard in pre planning, with risk assessments and logistics and that time has now been wasted. We also gave plenty of time to pay allowing parents to spread the cost because we appreciate how hard it can be to find money at short notice.

Year 2 Kidzania trip cancelled!

Last week I had to make a really difficult decision regarding a trip planned and organised for our year two children.

I think it is worth sharing how parents felt when they heard the news that this trip was cancelled:

I just wanted to send an email to say how disappointed I am that the trip has been cancelled. I understand it's beyond your control and I feel deeply disappointed for the children that have had to miss out. I cannot understand why certain parents could not pay the reasonable cost when the school gave us plenty of time to save for it.

I really feel for the teachers and staff that have organised this trip and activities leading up to it, for it to now be a no go.

There have been many parents commenting on social media today expressing their disappointment.

It's so upsetting to hear that the Kidzania trip for Year 2 has been cancelled due to lack of sufficient contributions. Are there any other plans to give the year 2 children a school trip this term - I know it's probably unlikely due to time constraints but it's just such a shame for the children who have worked really hard all year and taken sats this term. There are so many of the parents upset about it and cross at the situation (in no way blaming the school).

I just wanted to email to say how sorry the vast majority of us are to hear that the trip has had to be cancelled, we totally understand that the trip cannot go ahead with so few payments

I find the financial priorities of some parents unexplainable especially considering our year have all had free school dinners from reception saving over £1000 since our children started school The fact that the trip was planned following the vast majority agreeing to pay in the first place adds insult to injury

We have a year 2 parents group on Facebook and this morning there were many messages of support for the teachers regarding the trip (from those of us who paid)

This must be extremely demoralising for Mrs McGovern and Miss Baker please reassure them that we appreciate all their hard work and that we thoroughly support and value them. The only vague positive I can see from this is now maybe some parents will realise that these are not empty threats and that if things aren't paid for their child really will miss out Wishing the teachers a good weekend.

I am writing to express my sadness and disappointment that the year 2 trip has been cancelled. As a family with only one income I can understand the financial strains and burdens that others may face. However the planned trip to kidzania was reasonably priced and would have offered the children a fantastic experience. Parents who did not pay should have looked on the website to see how expensive it is and how reasonably priced the school fee was.

I would like to thank all those parents who wrote in with these words of support.

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You have shown your support and understanding and that means so much to us all. You made some excellent points and perhaps these are even more powerful coming from you.






Eating healthily and to a budget is something we feel affects most of us and we'd be really grateful if you could help us spread the word about the new series amongst your families at school.
