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

Year 6 were invited to watch a preview performance of Willingdon Community School's production of High School Musical, which included many of our past pupils.


We had a fantastic morning!

OUR HISTORY TEAM



Hello Polegate School families, let me introduce you to our history team. We are a passionate bunch who love history; especially our own local history!

I bet you walk along the cuckoo trail. Well, let me tell you that trains ran along there from 1880 and closed in 1968. Fun Fact right! Did you know that the Morrison's shop (which has been many shops before) used to be the old Polegate station. Who knew?

Have you ever wondered what might have been situated in School Lane? Your questions are answered – this school! It was also once situated in Hailsham Road. Wow, so many addresses! So those are fun facts right. Well, we are here to give you the sad news about our wonderful landmarks. A landmark is a property that has a special significance in history and culture. It can be a building, site, structure object or district.

Do you know what a listed building might be? A listed building is a structure of special architectural or historical interest. These buildings are graded as I, II* or II. Can you think of any?

Polegate Windmill is a grade II* listed building built in 1817. It was built for milling oats and was operated by wind power until 1942.

Not everyone in history bought readymade bags of flour, they had to purchase it from the miller at the mill and now it has been put on the AT RISK register.

STOP THE PRESS!

Polegate Windmill needs our help!

Rainwater has been leaking in from the windmill's cap and caused damage to the timber beams.

Over the next term we will be working hard to fundraise and raise awareness about our local landmarks and how we might be able to help. The first thing you could do, is take a visit to the windmill and see how beautiful our landmark is. Perhaps send in a photo to the History Team with you beside it!



Recently Chewy the therapy dog came to visit year 4. Much fun and cuddles were had by one all. Chewy will be visiting other classes soon.






MUSICAL MASTER
